Employer Incentives, Grants, and Supports

Name of Incentive/Grant	Administrator	Amount	Eligibility
Apprenticeship Job Creation Tax Credit	Canada Revenue Agency	10% of salaries or up to \$2,000	Available to employers who hire apprentices in the Red Seal trades.
Employer Incentive Grant	PETL	\$1000/apprentice/year \$1500/female or aboriginal apprentice/year	Must have registered apprentice. Funding provided upon successful completion of a block exam.
NB Youth Employment Fund	PETL	Up to \$10,000 for 30-hours per week for 26-weeks wage subsidy	Youth (18-29 yrs); unemployed, underemployed or working less than 15 hours per week; be referred by an employment counsellor; and must not be a full time student. Priority is for private sector businesses but other sectors that may be approved
NBMAP	New Brunswick	Increases the quality of training and knowledge

Workforce Expansion	PETL	Employer Wage Incentive utilizes temporary wage reimbursements to help establish permanent employment or annually recurring seasonal jobs. Canada NB Job Grant	PETL	The Canada-NB Job Grant program is an employer driven intervention to invest in the skills development and employment needs of the workforce. Governments' contribution is for two-thirds of the eligible training costs, up to a maximum of \$10,000 per training participant, per fiscal year. Apprentice Incentives, Grants, and Subsidized Supports

The majority of tuition for in-school apprenticeship training at public colleges is subsidized by the New Brunswick government. In addition, there are a variety of financial incentives and grants that can assist apprentices with paying for training and related costs:
